Tuition Fees Services

1. Programs run from Monday to Friday and lessons can be scheduled in the morning, in the afternoon or both.
2. Students will take a placement test prior to the program start. CET Vancouver will place the student in classes based on the placement test and an interview on the first day.
3. Periods of absence cannot be made up with a free extension of the program.
4. Students must comply with Canadian Immigration regulations while in Canada. CET Vancouver is required to report absences to the authorities.
5. CET Vancouver reserves the right to expel any student who does not abide by the terms and conditions elicited in the Orientation Package.

There are no any additional charges other than stated in the Statement Fees.

Homestay Services

1. Provide a safe, clean and comfortable home.
2. Provide a private, furnished bedroom which will include a bed, desk, lamp and storage space.
3. Provide two or three meals per day, 7 days a week.
4. Provide access to shared laundry, telephone, television, bath facilities and in certain homes, access to the Internet.
5. Provide a student convenient location in a residential area close to bus routes and downtown Vancouver.
6. Treat with respect and kindness.
7. Have family members who are English speaking Canadians citizens that encourage you and assist you with your language studies.
8. A comfortable and secure environment with a family that will support students during their stay in Canada.
9. Provide students with homestay counseling.

Accommodation available with

- 1- 2-meal plan I(breakfast and dinner)
- 2- 3-meal-plan (breakfast, lunch and dinner)

Meals description

Breakfast: A typical breakfast in Canada may include cereal, bacon, eggs, toast and jam, juice, tea or coffee.

Lunch: Family will provide students with food for your lunch.

Dinner: Dinner will vary from family to family.

Snacks: Food between meals.

Homestay for under age students

For students who are under 19 years of age, there is a custodianship/guardianship document and medical insurance compulsory requirement. If the student does not have a custodian or guardian, we will assist in finding one at a pre-determined fee.

Tuition cancellation and Refund policy

Before the Program Starts

1) Upon written cancellation CET Vancouver will withhold the following fees :

- at least 15 days before the program start date, registration fee, homestay placement and guardianship fees (if applicable).
- 14 days or less before the program start date, 20% of tuition fees, homestay placement and guardianship fees (if applicable).
- 10 days or less before the program start date, 30% of tuition fees, homestay placement and guardianship fees (if applicable).
- 7 days or less before the program start date, 40% of tuition fees, homestay placement and guardianship fees (if applicable).

Cancellations received on weekends or public holidays will be processed on the following business day.

2) Cancellation due to **visa refusals**: If the visa application is refused, provided we receive official confirmation from the Canadian Embassy or the Consulate, CET Vancouver will refund the participant in full with the exception of the C\$ 100 registration fee. All bank charges incurred are to be paid by the student. A copy of the visa rejection must be faxed to CET Vancouver at +1 604.669-2929.

Once the Program Starts

1) Upon written cancellation CET Vancouver will withhold the following fees:

- If the student has completed 10% of the program, 50% of tuition fees, registration fee, homestay placement, material and guardianship fees (if applicable).
- 2) If the student has completed 20% of the program, 100% of tuition fees, registration fee, homestay placement, material and guardianship fees (if applicable).
- 3) Cancellations received on weekends or public holidays will be processed on the following business day.
- 4) Cancellations are processed from the notification day onwards. Students must reapply after the cancellation has been processed, if they are wishing to continue with any program.
- 5) Cancellation fees are not transferable to third parties.
- 6) Changes to program choice (e.g. from Full Time to Part Time) are not permitted unless the program hours increase (e.g. from Part Time to Full Time).
- 7) Notification of program changes must be received in writing before changes take effect.

- 8) Materials are a fixed fee calculated on a monthly basis.
- 9) Cancellations and refunds are only processed by months not weeks.

Homestay Cancellation Policies

- I- Students who apply for CET Vancouver accommodation service must pay at least 3 weeks before the start date.
- 2- If students wish to cancel their accommodation, they are required to give 2 weeks written notice and will receive a full refund. Otherwise, a weekly fee will be withheld and paid to the host family.
- 3- The homestay placement fee of C\$210 is not refundable.
- 4- All accommodation is booked from Saturday or Sunday before the program start date until Saturday morning after the program end date, unless otherwise stated. A partial week may be counted and charged by the number of extra days.
- 5- A refundable housing deposit of C\$200 may be charged on arrival. This sum is returned unless there is damage, loss or extra cleaning to be paid for on the participant's departure.
- 6- Students who shorten their original Homestay registration period are required to give a **two-week notice to the host family**. Otherwise, the student is responsible for compensating the host family for that period.
- 7- After staying for two months or longer, students are required to give one month notice.
- 8- Any requests to extend or shorten your Homestay period must be discussed in advanced with the Homestay Coordinator and the Student Agency.
- 9- Vacations and Holidays: No refunds or extensions are given for days spent away from the host Family's home during your Homestay period. If you are planning an extended vacation and do not wish the host family to hold the room for them, students must notify the Family in writing 2 weeks before their extended vacation.
- 10- Students cannot make any "special" or "private" arrangements directly with their host families.
- II- Students who violate these rules will be evicted from the home and will not be eligible for a refund.

Insurance

1. Students must arrange full medical insurance for the duration of their stay in Canada before departure. Students must provide proof of the insurance showing the expiration date. CET Vancouver offers medical insurance at the cost of \$ 15.00 CAD per week.
2. Students must include information regarding any mental or physical illness, special needs, allergies, or other conditions that may interfere with their ability to successfully complete their program.

CET Vancouver does not accept liability in case of illness, accident, loss or damage to personal effects or property.
